Undamaged windows are not evidence of staged Ukraine violence



- Google reverse image search was used to identify the original photo
- With Google Street view, the journalists could geolocate the building
- Testimony about the situation was found on social media
- Military experts were contacted
- AFP called the telephone number shown on a van parked near the orange car visible in the social media posts, and reached the manager of the company. He sent photos of the damage
- AFP also searched the address of the building, found a medical company and talked to its manager.





Documenting every single fact has become essential. For Bucha, we went as far as investigating each victim of Yablonska Street.















The way we work has changed because of disinformation. We have to be able to prove everything and be much more rigorous than ever.
