7 CIRCULATING FALSE NARRATIVES

TREND #1

Questioning the war, from its reality to its motives

The war is staged (e.g., [here](#))

Focus on Bucha as staged by Ukrainians (e.g., [here](#))

→ 21% of analysis

TREND #2

Unsubstantiated information about military operations

Out of context videos and pictures (e.g., [here](#))

Focus on NATO bases and bio-weapons labs under Azovstal plant (e.g., [here](#))

→ 21% of analysis

TREND #3

Distorted representation of Ukrainians and Zelensky

Ukrainians are neo-Nazis (e.g., [here](#))

Discreditation of Zelensky (e.g., [here](#))

→ 18% of analysis

TREND #4

Discrediting media reporting on Ukraine

Media is falsely reporting on the war (e.g., [here](#))

Targeting mainstream media (e.g., [here](#))

→ 11% of analysis

TREND #5

Disinformation on responsibility for Ukrainian civilian casualties

False confirmation of Russian responsibility (e.g., [here](#))

False information on killing of civilians by Ukrainian army (e.g., [here](#))

→ 8% of analysis

TREND #6

Disinformation on Ukrainian refugees

Financially favored by host governments (e.g., [here](#))

Questioning the need of fleeing Ukraine (e.g., [here](#))

→ 8% of analysis

TREND #7

NEW

False information on foreign support for Ukraine

Focus on alleged military intervention (e.g., [here](#))

Focus on societal support (e.g., [here](#))

→ 8% of analysis

→5% of analysis of analysis did not fall in any of the above trends

EARLY-WARNINGS: WHAT TO EXPECT

1. Disinformation on export of natural gas

Following Russian halt on gas supplies to Poland and Bulgaria, the Kremlin has issued warnings on similar consequences for other European Union costumers. Given the weight of the economic consequences of the war on the global energy supply chain, this could become an easy target of future disinformation.


2. Disinformation on escalation of the diplomatic crisis

Given the worsening diplomatic relations between western countries and Russia, disinformation pointing to a dramatic escalation of the crisis is likely to be the focus of future campaigns.

Repartition of trends in the fact-checking analysis published by the EDMO network between 20.04.2022 and 27.04.2022




