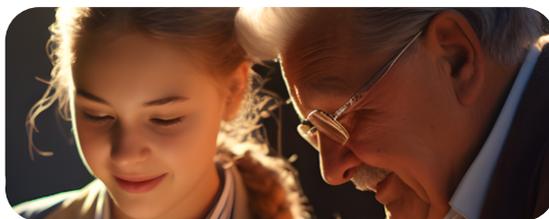
How can you teach (young) people about propaganda, conspiracy theories and misleading information on the internet? **EDMO Belux** shares 6 tips on how to do this in the classroom.
